

Graduate and Professional Education

Institutions must make available to current and prospective students information regarding the types of graduate and professional education in which graduates of the institutions 4-year degree programs enrolled, the source of the information, and any time frames and methodology associated with it.

In March every year graduates from the prior May receive the ONU Graduate Questionnaire and are asked to self-report either employment or full-time or part-time student status in graduate school. The following presents student responses to the survey.

Statistics taken from the Olivet Nazarene University undergraduate senior class of 2014 indicate that 239 of 515 (46%) graduates responded to the survey as either having employment or attending graduate school. Graduate schools listed include but are not limited to:
