About OLIVET

Founded in 1907, Olivet is a Christian liberal arts university accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, a member of the North Central Association, and affiliated with the Church of the Nazarene. Olivet exists to provide a university-level liberal arts "Education with a Christian Purpose." With a main campus in Bourbonnais, Illinois, just 45 miles from Chicago, Olivet serves over 3,500 students (2,500 undergraduate) on campus and online.

About ONU+



ONU+ is network of sites where students attend to take online courses from Olivet so that students can stay involved in their local community, church, or organization. Many courses feature an interactive, hybrid model where professors provide one-hour of live instruction over video conferencing while students also complete assignments, discussions, and learning activities at their own pace each week. In addition to coursework, many sites offer leadership training, practical experience, and engaging activities for college-age students.

STRUCTURE & LOAD

All courses are offered during Olivet's standard fall / spring schedules. Most courses are 8-week block courses. Students complete between 12-18 credits per semester, taking two or three courses per block plus an ONU+ Community Seminar course each semester for all full-time ONU+ students. The unique and exciting Seminar allows students to unite with other ONU+ classmates in the pursuit of learning, camaraderie, and academic excellence.

MODALITY

All course content is delivered online with a quality curriculum taught by Olivethired faculty. Students complete classes in partnership with your local site for social and spiritual support. Many courses include one hour per week of full-class synchronous learning, allowing students to enjoy live interaction with professors and classmates from around the world, a special feature not found in other online programs of study.

TECHNOLOGY

Each student must have access to reliable internet, a computer that will accommodate video conferencing programs, and a fully-functional webcam/microphone.

Through ONU PLUS, you will earn a college degree while having the flexibility to remain at home and continue to work a part-time job.



REDUCED TUITION

Academic Programs

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Business Administration is a program designed to expose students to the qualitative and quantitative aspects of business, including entrepreneurship, accounting, business administration, information technology, finance, and marketing. The program focuses on the integration of real-life experience to the academic coursework to apply critical thinking skills to identify, analyze, and solve business related problems from a Christian worldview.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT

The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in child development is designed for the student who wants to work with children outside of a classroom setting. Child development offers a holistic approach to child studies focusing on the physical, emotional, social, and intellectual development of a child. At Olivet, students will plan and design activities for young children, as well as learn how to identify emotional or developmental problems.

CHRISTIAN MINISTRY

The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Christian Ministry interweaves an academic and practical education for ministry, preparing students to serve God and people in the setting of today's Church. This program provides entry-level knowledge and skills in the areas of biblical studies, theology, philosophy, and the history of Christianity, as well as practices such as Christian education and spiritual formation.

COMPUTER SCIENCE

The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Computer Science is designed so that students will have a foundation in a wide range of disciplines in the Computer Science and Emerging Technologies (CSET) field. Students will take CSET core courses intermixing them with courses specific to their concentration. CSET offers three concentrations to choose from in the B.S. in Computer Science program: Software Development, Software Entrepreneurship, and Network & Data Communications.


CYBERSECURITY

The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Cybersecurity prepares students for in demand, global positions n education, military, healthcare, criminal justice, or business. This program focuses on developing the technical competence needed to fill the growing number of positions across the world. By taking several additional network specific courses, students may earn a double major in Computer Science and in Cybersecurity.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Early Childhood Education is a program suited for those with a heart for teaching young children. This degree will prepare students for the Illinois Early Childhood Professional Educator License / ESL endorsement. At Olivet, early childhood education majors have opportunities in and outside the classroom to learn and grow in their field. These students will study instructional methods, children's literature, language development, and sociology of the family, as well as learn about the philosophies of early childhood education
